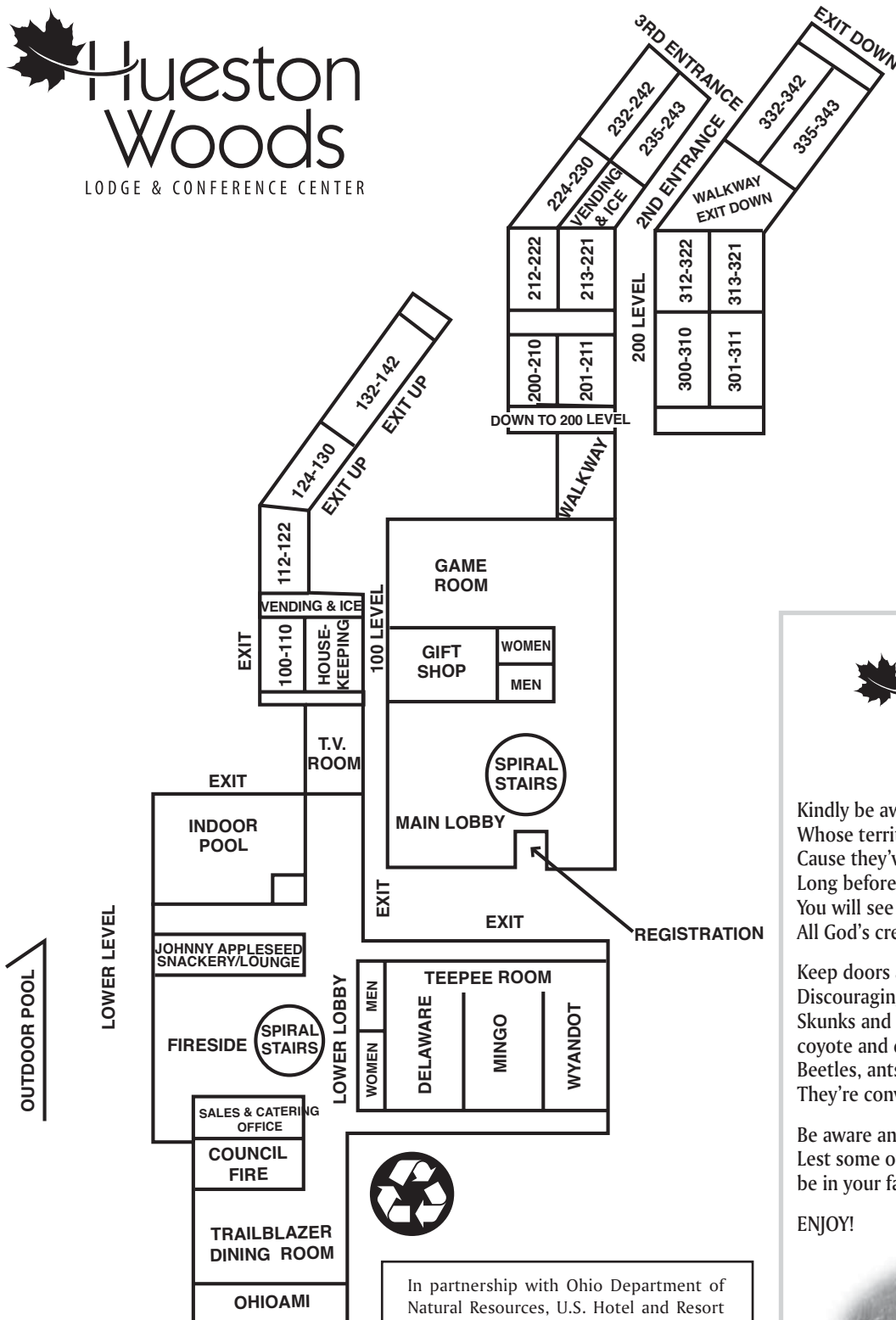

PUBLIC AREAS: As a reminder, public areas (i.e. lobby areas) are for the enjoyment of all guests. Our company policy requires that food be purchased through the lodge and consumed only in the dining room, lounge or private meeting room. Therefore, no food is to be consumed in the lobby areas. Private meeting rooms are available through the Sales Office for larger gatherings. Touch 0

RELIGIOUS SERVICES: A list of local services is posted in the Lobby. Hours may vary by season.

Cabin Information

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Occupants of the cabins are not permitted to carry or consume alcoholic beverages in open containers outside the cabin.

FURNISHINGS: Cabins are furnished with coffee pots, dishes, pots and pans and linens.

LIABILITY: Occupants are legally responsible for adherence to park rules and guidelines including theft, vandalism, noise or disruption. If a complaint is filed by another registered guest, a ranger will be notified for investigation. If any violation is determined, the cabin occupants causing the complaint will be required to leave immediately, forfeiting any refund or monies owed.

LINEN: There is no daily housekeeping service in the cabins. Linen may be exchanged on Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon at the housekeeping entrance across from room 102.

OCCUPANCY: Maximum six persons per cabin, children under 12 years not included. All individuals must be registered at check-in. The cabin must be occupied only by the person(s) registered.

OTHER: Please review complete rules and regulations posted in each cabin.

OUTDOOR COOKING: Grills are permitted. All of our cabins have fire rings. Do not leave grills or campfires unattended.

PARKING: Please park in designated areas only, two vehicles per cabin maximum. Additional vehicles may be parked at the lodge. Please do not park on the grass; vehicles will be towed.

TENTS/CAMPERS: No tents or camper trailers are permitted in cabin area.

VISITORS: Visiting hours for cabin areas are 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily. Visitors' vehicles should be parked in the lodge parking area. Use of lodge and cabin facilities are restricted to registered guests only, not visitors.

The Great Ohio Lodges, in accordance with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, provide a "smoke free" environment to park guests.

Park History

The park has an interesting history dating back to 1797. Matthew Hueston, while serving with General Anthony Wayne, observed the fertile soil in southwestern Ohio. When the Indian resistance subsided, Hueston began to buy land in what is now Butler and Preble counties. He is apparently one of the earliest conservationists in Ohio, for he preserved part of his forest, as did the Huestons who followed him. Today the towering beech and sugar maple of the virgin forest stand as living monuments to his foresight.

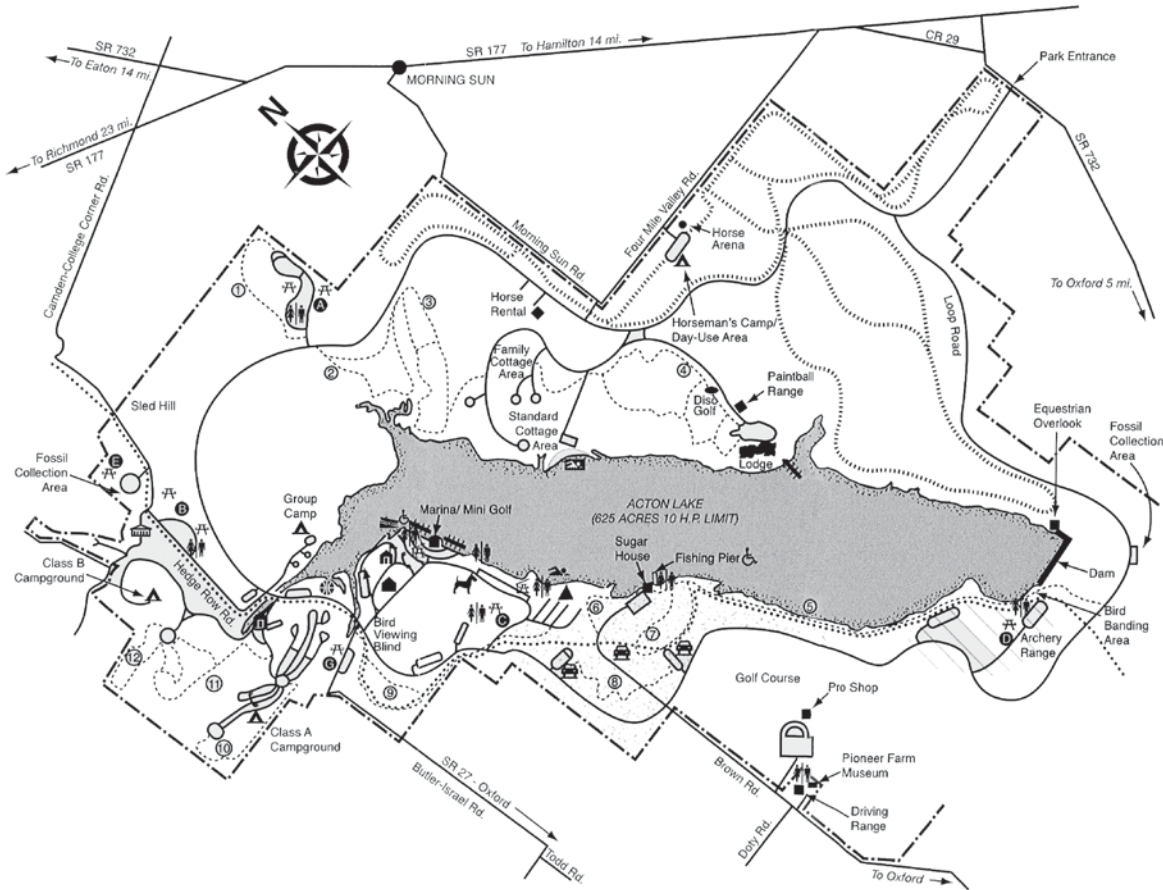
When the last of the Huestons died in the 1930s, the land was purchased by Morris G. Taylor, a banker from Hamilton, Ohio, who realized its aesthetic and educational value. In 1940, Cloyd Acton, State Representative from Eaton, influenced the state legislature to appropriate funds to acquire the former Hueston holding. Taylor then sold his land, at no personal gain, to the State of Ohio for a state forest park. A dam across Four Mile Creek was completed in 1956

and Acton Lake was impounded in April 1957. Now under the supervision of the Division of Parks and Recreation, Hueston Woods State Park covers 3,596 acres, including 625-acre Acton Lake and 200 acres of virgin forest.

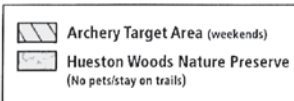

LOCATION MAP



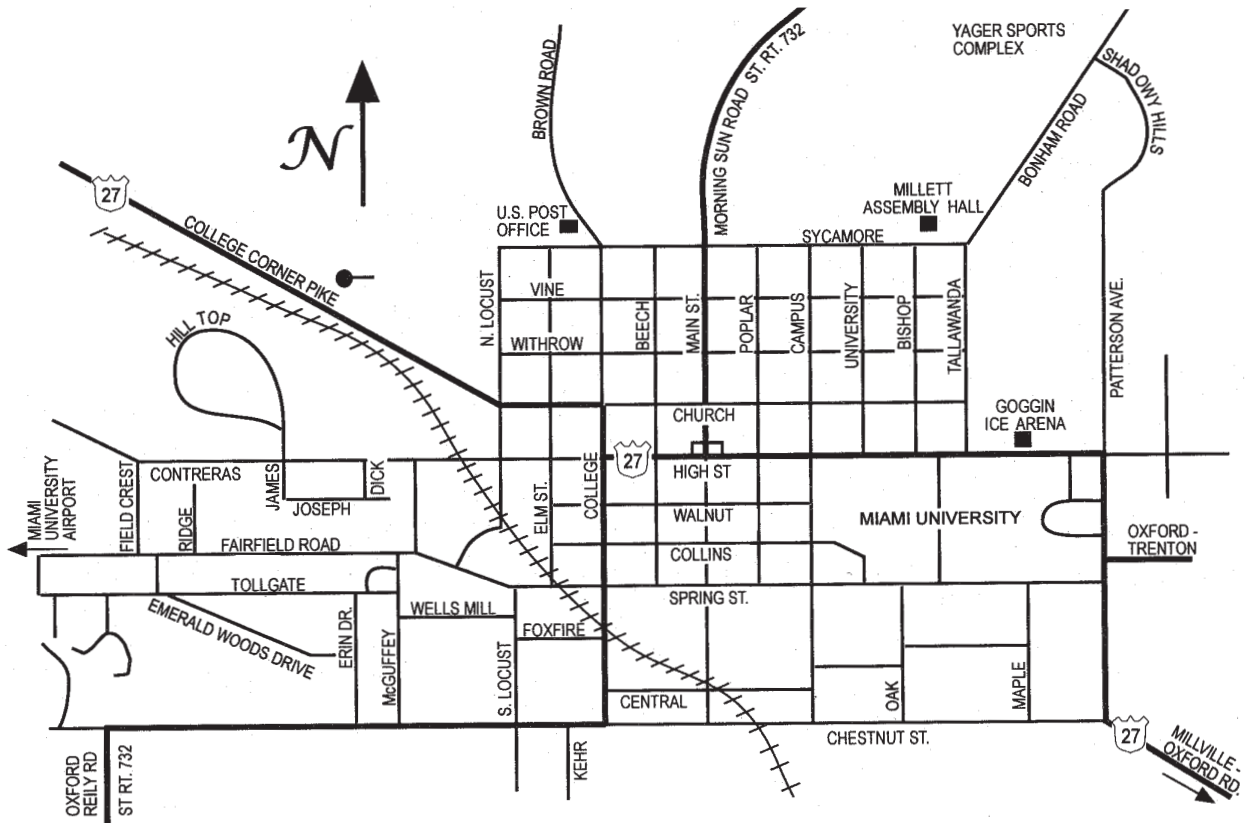

Oxford Map & History



In 1792, President George Washington signed an act of Congress that mandated that one complete township of the John Cleves Symmes purchase be set aside in support of higher education.

The Ohio General Assembly established the college land grant section Oxford Township, and the venue of higher education chartered in 1809 became Miami University. Later the trustees platted the village that became "Oxford."

Miami opened its doors in 1824 and the Village was incorporated in 1830. The academic community attracted scholars from the East, as well as Southerners

moving North in protest against slavery. These influences remain evident today in Oxford's unique architecture and broad streets; a blending of New England and Southern styles can be seen in many nineteenth century homes within what's now referred to as "the old mile square."

In 1960, a charter form of government was adopted, and a decade later population growth had turned the "village" into a full-fledged city. Oxford continues to grow, as has Miami University, and together they share a tradition of excellence, the continuing vitality of youth and the serene beauty of a campus that has been called "the loveliest in the nation."

Fire Safety

Behind your guest room door, you will find a floor plan of the guest room corridor on which your guest room is located. Please study it carefully and then take a moment to walk this corridor and familiarize yourself with it. Take special notice of the number of doors to reach the exit and which direction to turn, as the corridor may have smoke in it making it nearly impossible to identify the exit door from any other door in that area. Also, note the location of the fire extinguishers, fire alarm pull boxes, and the automatic closing fire/smoke doors.

Please acquaint yourself with the following procedures. They will help you in the unlikely event of an emergency:

- Pre-plan your escape route. Locate and check out both the nearest exit door and the stairwell. Count the guest room doors between your room and the exit. Remember, the balcony may also be used as an exit.
- Know where you placed your guest room key. You will need your key in the event that you wish to re-enter your room during an emergency. Get in the habit of leaving your key in the same place, preferably on the night stand.
- If you discover smoke or fire:
 1. Call the Front Desk immediately.
 2. Feel the door. If it's hot, don't open it.
 3. If the door is not hot, place your foot against the door and open it slightly.
 4. Look and smell for smoke and odors. Remember, you may be able to exit the stairwell by crawling. There is always less smoke near the floor.
 5. Leave your room and close your door.
- 6. If you are able, pull the nearest fire alarm box.
- 7. Use exit stairways or fire escapes.
- 8. Don't panic! If you see no fire or smoke in the corridor, head to the nearest fire exit and proceed to ground level and out of the building.
- 9. If the halls are too smoky stay in your room.
 - a. Fill the bathtub with water; however, never get into the tub.
 - b. Stuff towels in all openings and around all doors. Use wet tissue to insulate small openings.
 - c. Wet down anything that is hot, such as doors and walls.
 - d. Open glass doors only at intervals for fresh air. If smoke becomes dense, stick your head out of the door or window.
 - e. Await help from the fire department.

Tornado Emergency Procedures

If you observe a tornado or hear the warning sirens for a tornado, take the following steps immediately:

- Find Shelter! Go to the basement or a place that is on the lowest floor in the middle of the lodge, like an interior hall.
- Avoid windows and doors. Move away from outside walls and stay clear of windows, doors or other glass.
- Protect your head. Try to take shelter under something strong that can protect your head, like a heavy table or a workbench. At the very least, use your arms and hands to protect your head.
- Stay put until either the threat passes or you are advised that it is all clear.
- If damage has occurred, remain away from these areas until they are declared clear by emergency personnel. Keep away from exposed wires.
- If you are caught in your room with no time to get out, go into the bathroom, close the door, and sit on the floor or in the tub.

CHILDREN'S ACTIVITIES: A schedule of activities will be posted throughout the lodge for children at the lodge and cabins (seasonal).

GAME ROOM: We offer one ping-pong table and several video games for your enjoyment. Token machines located near game room.

PARLOR GAMES: Available at the Front Desk.

POOL (INDOOR): Swimming available 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. for our overnight guests. NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY. PLEASE, FOR YOUR SAFETY, CHILDREN MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY PARENT OR GUARDIAN. Located on the lower level of the lodge. No glassware in the pool area please.

RECREATIONAL FACILITIES: Equipment is available at the Front Desk.

OUTDOOR

BADMINTON: Equipment available at the Front Desk. Located at the side yard adjacent to the outdoor pool area.

BASKETBALL: Ball available at the Front Desk. Located at the side yard adjacent to the outdoor pool area.

BEACH: Seasonal. Hours 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Located approximately three miles around the lake near the marina.

CAMPING: Hueston Woods offers Class "A" and Class "B" campsites. Electrical hook-ups, flush toilets and showers. Phone 1-866-644-6727 for additional information.

CORNHOLE: Equipment available at the Front Desk.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING: In season (No equipment rental).

DISC GOLF: Disc golf is played much like traditional golf. Instead of a ball and clubs, however, players use a flying disc.

FISHING: Persons 16 years of age and over must possess a valid Ohio fishing license.

GOLF COURSE: For the golf enthusiast, Hueston Woods State Park operates an 18-hole championship golf course. Call for tee times. Touch 9-523-8081.

HIKING/NATURE TRAILS: Park maps are available at the Front Desk showing trails throughout the park.

HORSESHOES: Horseshoes and pits are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Horseshoes are available at Front Desk.

JOGGING: Miles of roads and trails. Please maintain visibility to vehicular traffic.



MARINA: Canoes, motorboats, pontoons and kayaks are available to rent. Snack Bar and Bait Shop. Seasonal hours. Located approximately three miles around the lake, next to the Park Office (seasonal). Call 523-8859 for rental information.

PICNIC AREAS: Seven locations; see map at the Front Desk.

POOL (OUTDOOR): Open Memorial Day through Labor Day 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. CHILDREN UNDER 16 YEARS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY PARENT OR GUARDIAN. No glassware in the pool area, please.

SHUFFLEBOARD: Equipment available at the Front Desk. Located in the back yard adjacent to outdoor pool area.

SLEDDING: Equipment rental not available. Permitted near Hedge Row picnic area.

TENNIS: Equipment rental available at the Front Desk. Lighted courts. Located near the upper level parking lot.

VOLLEYBALL: Ball available at the Front Desk. Located in side yard adjacent to outdoor pool area.

MIAMI UNIVERSITY CAMPUS: One of America's oldest and most beautiful campuses, Miami has been called by poet Robert Frost "the prettiest college that ever there was." With buildings of red brick Georgian colonial design and acres of green space, formal gardens and flower beds, it reflects more than 180 years of careful planning and a lot of "tender, loving care." One of a handful of state-assisted colleges and universities long recognized for superior educational opportunities, it has been identified as one of America's "Public Ivy's."

WESTERN COLLEGE CAMPUS: Oxford is more than a college town. For more than a century it was a town of colleges, with no less than five separate and distinct institutions of higher learning within its original square mile prior to the Civil War. One of these was the Western College for Women, established in 1853 as the western outpost of Mt. Holyoke College of Massachusetts. Now part of Miami University, the scenic 251-acre Western College Campus, off Route 27, is the home of the nationally acclaimed School of Interdisciplinary Studies.

OXFORD COLLEGE HALL: Believed to be the oldest women's college building in America, dating back to 1849, it first housed the Oxford Female Institute, later renamed the Oxford College for Women. Now it serves as a women's residence hall of Miami University. The founder and first president of O.F.I. was John Witherspoon Scott, whose daughter Caroline, born in Oxford, married a Miami student, Benjamin Harrison, who later became the 23rd President of the United States.

THE OLD SEMINARY CHURCH: One of the five pre-Civil War colleges in Oxford was a Presbyterian Seminary located at the corner of Church (of course!) and Poplar streets. It is still there, though no longer in the business of preparing ministers but rather of serving the people of Oxford.

LEWIS PLACE: Called by the celebrated architect Frank Lloyd Wright "the most beautiful house in Oxford," this 17-room mansion was built in 1839 for a couple from Connecticut, Jane and Romeo Lewis, who had come to Oxford by way of Florida, where Romeo had been one of the founders of Tallahassee. Elements of the deep South, as well as New England, can be discerned in this gracious home which, over the years, has sheltered a number of guests including U.S. presidents, governors, senators, ambassadors, foreign heads of state and many others. Since 1902 it has served as the home of the presidents of Miami University.

MCGUFFEY MUSEUM: (Open Saturday & Sunday, 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.) At the corner of Spring and Oak Streets in the heart of the Miami University campus, stands the two-story red-brick home built by William Holmes McGuffey when he was a member of the Miami Faculty. It was there, in the mid-1830's that he wrote the first editions of the celebrated *McGuffey Readers*. These school books shaped manners and morals of America for more than a century, establishing the reputation of Professor McGuffey as "the Schoolmaster of the Nation." Still in print more than 150 years and 130,000,000 copies later, they have outsold every book in the history of publishing with one exception, the *Holy Bible*!
